## THANK YOU

We send a big thank you to *StreetSmart* for their donation of \$1,000 and ladies clothing and knitted

We have also received a number of donations of clothing from deceased estates and fruit from local gardens. We sincerely thank everyone.

## MONTHLY VOUCHERS

Apparently June's distribution of family vouchers was down compared to March by 13% and single vouchers down by 9%. Also noted that compared to this time <u>last</u> <u>year</u> food parcels are down by 23%! There was also a drop by a whopping 40% in the number of fruit & vegetable bags and bread being taken !!! I find this surprising as every time I have volunteered- it's been really busy!!

Maybe people are forgetting to put down their postcode on the sheet?? Our shorter hours may also be a major contributing factor?

As we have received some additional funds from *Department of Social Services (DSS)*, the committee has decided to increase the value of the Coles vouchers.

From **August 1**<sup>st</sup> - singles vouchers will be **\$50**, household vouchers will be **\$60**.

It will be interesting to see what future data shows, as most volunteers feels it is getting busier.

## <u>Training</u>

The on-going training session held in August was a great success with 20 volunteers

attending. The guest speaker was unable to attend due to illness, Allison organised a quiz

instead. Kathy gave us an update on what is happening with the <u>Monash Council grant application</u>.

When the grant request was finally submitted for consideration, Council decided they were unwilling to set a precedent and consequently would not approve the **paid position** of coordinator.

Instead we were told we would be required to apply for a one-off grant of approximately \$78,000 by  $26^{th}$ 

July. Again, this was an arduous task requiring at least 500 words per question. Chris from Waverley has agreed to collaborate with us on the writing of the application. It has been confirmed that no organization other than MOCSIS will be eligible to apply for this grant. However, it cannot be used for the salary of a paid coordinator. Furthermore, we were advised not to use the word **coordinator** in the application.

We sought the services of a project manager to help us and we were successful in receiving the grant. YAY

*However*....... Kathy has now to do MORE paperwork before the funds will be deposited into our bank account!!! It's just a waiting game.

Here's hoping that Kathy has not been strangled by the red tape Karen suggested should be included in the next submission!

The Director of Community Services agreed our current position was not sustainable and this funding could be used to look at merging the 2 organisations, and reviewing our business model to improve our viability. There will be another meeting on the 18<sup>th</sup> September, to progress the merge process.

Our next training will be at South Oakleigh Bowling Club on North Road, at **1.30-3.30pm-1**<sup>st</sup> October. The speaker will be Annika Povey Registered Psychiatric Nurse and Case Manager Monash Health Community Mental Health Service. This is the Service at the end of Downing Street in Atherton Road who occasionally send clients to MOCSIS. The topic will be 'An understanding of Mental Health conditions and some of the challenges they bring'. This may assist us to understand the background of some of the clients who seek support from us and to assist them in an appropriate way in an emergency relief setting. There will be time for questions following the presentation.

Could you please place your name in the diary with your RSVP to assist us with catering for afternoon tea to follow the presentation. Mt Waverley CSIS has also been invited. Please let *Liz or Allison* know if you need transport to the venue.

We welcome you all to the MOCSIS family!!


#### Here we have Lyn and John.

### Pharmacy

Just a reminder about free medication- Terry White Chemist. The money is through philanthropic sources and it is believed there are sufficient funds for 3 years- a first for MOCSIS and the pharmacy. 277, Huntingdale Rd Chadstone.

The process is in the top of filing cabinet 5 – labelled Chemist. It must be a PBS script and the client needs to go to the pharmacy. If the client cannot get there, we need to scan the script and send it through; Terry White will arrange home delivery.

Data entry:- Funding source is community donations and assistance type is Health.

#### Kathy's email from 24th July has extra detail.

Apparently some clients have presented a health care card with another family member's name, other than their own. Check that the client's name matches the current health card and the prescription, otherwise the pharmacist won't be able to help the client.

## **Back Door**

The new lock is on a slight angle, instead of being vertical when in the locked position. The key is the same as before. If unsure, lock from the outside, then close the door.
